ONTARIO PRO CHALLENGE SERIES DRIVER CONDUCT - 2025

General Principle

Drivers are expected to conduct themselves in a professional and non-disruptive manner both on and off the track.

Drivers are responsible for the conduct of their crew members, guests and anyone else associated with their team and may suffer penalties as a result of their conduct.

Prohibited Conduct

Drivers, their crews, guests and associates, as applicable, shall not:

- Verbally or physically threaten or assault another driver, crew member, guest, associate or race official.
- Use vulgar or derogatory language or gestures (including on track).
- Engage in rough driving or retaliatory behaviour, attempt to gain a position under caution, speed in the pit area or fail to follow the on or off track instructions of a track official;
- Attempt entry to speedway without payment or signing of required waiver;
- Failure to adhere to the Alcoholic & Substance Policies of the visited track.
- Engage in conduct which is unsportsmanlike or is deemed to be detrimental to the Ontario Pro Challenge Series.

Penalties

One or more of the following types of penalties may be imposed by officials in their sole discretion for Prohibited Conduct: (i) warning and/or probation; (ii) loss of one or more race positions and points; (iii) disqualification with total loss of race event's positions and points; (iv) suspension for a definite or indefinite period of time; (v) total or partial loss of accrued points; (vi) expulsion for serious or repeated offenses.

Complaints

If a driver feels that Prohibited Conduct has occurred, the driver shall immediately report such conduct to an Ontario Pro Challenge Series Official. The driver making the complaint shall not discuss the alleged Prohibited Conduct with the driver, crew member, guest or associate against whom the complaint has been made unless requested to do so by and in the presence of an Ontario Pro Challenge Official.

No Appeal

The decisions of Ontario Pro Challenge officials as to whether Prohibited Conduct has occurred and the penalty or penalties to be imposed as a result thereof shall be final and not subject to appeal.
